## School Readiness Test 2021

## Snowy 2.0 Concreting Day

After a long stint of home learning, our Snowy 2.0 Construction class were finally able to get their hands and PPE dirty for the first time, in their concreting practical day. The student spent the day mixing and pouring concrete to make concrete pavers and sleepers. The Snowy 2.0 class prepares students to enter into school-based traineeships in Construction and/or Manufacturing in Year 11.

The program specifically targets the skill set needed to work in pre-cast yard of the Snowy 2.0 Construction Project. Future Generation Joint Venture have kindly supplied all PPE, including boots, high-vis work wear, hard hats and safety glasses. This helps the students get used to wearing PPE before entering construction sites.

This is the second year the Snowy 2.0 preparation program has run. In 2022 the program will expand to include a business administration stream - where students will prepare to enter trainee ships in business services and retail.


