Their questions were broadcast live across the world over amateur radio. The audience were on the edge of their seats while, Astronaut on the International Space Station (ISS), Mark Vande Hei responded to 20 questions in a 10-minute window.

130 people had the privilege of attending the event on Wednesday 19 May, while others watched the live stream.

The students did a fantastic job, asking great questions and presenting them like clock work.

Astronaut Mark Vande Hei's response to Maya's question was relevant for many of us, "...do things that are outside of your comfort zone, do things that you love, always do things that involve risk of failure, always do your best...."

Charlee asked about the most important aspect of training in preparation for living in space, and the response was, in addition to the technical training "getting along well with each other" was also very important.

Eloise and Laura's question received some chuckles from the audience. "How do you cut your hair and shave in space without making a mess?" The answer was with an electric razor with an intake vent and wet wipes, or hair clippers attached to a vacuum cleaner.

Astronaut Mark thought that Hollie's question was a particularly good question, "What goes through your head while on the launch pad, about to launch?"

The response from Mark as a first time pilot was "do not mess this up", the second time Mark was able to soak it all in.

Lani was intrigued with being able to see the climate of our planet changing and geophysical hazards from the ISS. Astronauts could see fires, hurricanes, volcanic eruptions and shrinking of glaciers.

Julian's question was about unexplained occurrence or suspicious things in space. The response was about M & M's floating suspiciously to one side, the reason was due to orbital mechanics. Like Kristy McBain MP, many people in the audience noted that aliens were not mentioned.

Sophie's question was about the Milky Way, for the astronauts to see its beauty, they need to turn lights off.

Mark told Natasha that they do not use Facetime but video conference their families instead.

Cameron asked his final question about WIFI on the ISS, but the signal cut-out.





Both Mrs Fenton and Ms Marshall's Digital Technology classes are coding and constructing an alarm system to go onto a jewellery box or treasure chest to let them know if someone tries to open it.

They have been experimenting with different types of inputs - such as motion sensors and light sensors, and outputs such as buzzers and LED lights. Student will construct their own battery powered circuit and adapt a computer code to make the alarm work.

The new Innovation Hub has been a great space for learning about Digital technologies. We look forward to seeing their finished products.
