The BULLY Project Australia defines an "upstander" as "someone who recognises when something is wrong and acts to make it right. When an upstander sees or hears about someone being bullied, they speak up. Being an upstander is being a hero: we are standing up for what is right and doing our best to help support and protect someone who is being hurt."

Upstander behaviour can be observed as;

An individual or group standing up to show their appreciation and support for human rights and taking action in support of themselves and/or others i.e. combatting negative attitudes and behaviours. Upstander behaviour differs to by-stander behaviour which often involves standing by with little interference or no action/ involvement in situations that reflect discriminatory attitudes or behaviours such as derogatory jokes, offensive language, excluding comments, bullying, harassment, violence or abuse.

On Wednesday 26 May, Monaro High School Boys' Rugby 7s teams travelled to Canberra to play in the Brumbies High School competition.

In the 7/8 Division our Year 8 boys came out strongly against local rival St Patricks with a 42-0 win. Tries were awarded to Ayden Palmer 3, Tanis Breden 2, George Tsitsikronis, Alexi Alcock and Khian Flanagan. The second match was against Trinity Catholic College from Goulburn where the team once again triumphed 17-0. Tries were awarded to Ayden Palmer, Khian Flanagan and Jett Kelly. The toughest pool game was next against Radford College and despite a final last second effort ended in a 19-all draw. Tries were awarded to Ayden Palmer, Khian Flanagan and Judah Filiga. This meant that Monaro needed to beat Jindabyne Central by at least 24 points to make the Grand Final. The boys were systematic and went to work winning by 45-0. Tries were awarded to Khian Flanagan 3, Ayden Palmer 3, Tanis Breden, Tyrell Bartlett, Archie Blyton and Darcy Rudd. The Grand Final was to be against Mary McKillop and with some niggling injuries and fatigue the boys needed to come out firing. Unfortunately, McKillop were up for the fight. With some speedsters out wide they scored quickly and despite a fightback, Monaro was unable to get back into the contest. A try was awarded to Jett Kelly.

In the 9/10 Division the Year 10 boys faced some strong opposition against Mary McKillop going down 15-10 with tries awarded to Talon Kelly and Jordan Williams. Despite pressuring their line in the opening minutes of the game Trinity Catholic College were just too good. This meant our last game of the day was a local derby against St Patricks and then Jindabyne Central. Monaro were too good for both teams coming out on top to finish the day on a high.
