Sydney University HSC Study Days



With the expertise of Malcolm Anderson and Ben Dwyer (SMRC Water and Sewage Technicians) the students gained a deeper understanding the testing and regulations involved in this real life science application.



Year 9 & 10 Market Day

There was a bustle of activity as students and teachers explored and enjoyed the first Market Day in the Quad at Monaro High on Monday 21 June. Students from the Year 9 and 10 Commerce classes hosted stalls offering a variety of products and services. Cupcakes, lolly bags, homemade slices and treats satisfied sweet tooth's. The sausages and hash browns proved popular as did the gourmet burgers and hot chips. Students wanting something different could get their hair dyed, buy stickers or spin the wheel to win prize.

The homemade bath salts and soaps proved particularly popular with the teachers. This involved coming up with their own business name, choosing the products, setting prices and marketing.

However, 11 of the 18 businesses returned a profit and the highest return was achieved by three Year 9 boys who ran the business Snags and Hashies.

Overall, it was a successful day, the event was enjoyed by all and a great learning experience for the students. Monaro High School Market Day will continue as a yearly fixture and we can't wait for 2022.







Y11 PDHPE University of Wollongong

Last term the Year 11 PDHPE class travelled to Wollongong to supplement their classroom learning of the 'Body in Motion' with practical applications. They travelled down on Monday afternoon and participated in some Indoor Rock Climbing at Hangdog before staying overnight to get an early start at the University of Wollongong the next morning.

Their first activity on Tuesday was attending the Anatomy Laboratory where the were able to look at the skeletal, muscular and cardiorespiratory systems of both models and specimens including cadaveric material. The group then participated in a High Intensity Fitness Class at the University Recreation Centre before completing a tour of the Campus to see what university life was like. The trip proved to be fun whilst an educational way to consolidate their knowledge.
