## HSC Dancers Complete Practical Component

Mrs Preston and Monaro High School would like to congratulate Deana Hedger and Amelia Peri for the completion of the practical component of their HSC Dance course, which was completed on Tuesday 16 August.

The exams were 80% of the course content and they performed their Core Performance and Major Study Performance dances and completed two separate interviews based on dance technique, safe dance practice and performance quality. They also presented their Core Compositions, danced by other students, and completed an elaboration explaining the choreographic processes used in the creation of the works.

The students will now focus on their Core Appreciation component which makes up the last 20% of their course which will be completed in November during the HSC examination period.

This is a first for Monaro High School, as the course has not been run at the school previously.











## Yamaga - Virtual Cultural Exchange

A virtual cultural exchange was held between students of Monaro High School and schools in the Yamaga district on Wednesday 17 August.

Since 2006, Yamaga and Cooma have had a Sister-City relationship through partnerships between the two councils and Lions Clubs. Every second year, students and staff from Monaro High along with Cooma Lions Club and Council representatives travel to Yamaga and the next year a Japanese delegation has been hosted in Cooma.

Due to the Covid19 Pandemic, the exchange has been on hold since 2020. This year, both groups took the opportunity to do a virtual version of the exchange.

Students from the Year 9/10 Japanese class and members of the Monaro High School Leo Club joined online with Yamaga to play games, share videos of our schools and community and participate in a rock painting activity. Students learnt a lot about Yamaga and the way of life of teenagers in Japan, a valuable experience for all.

## Why Do Tiny Graphs... When You Can Do MASSIVE Ones?!!

As part of their module on forces, 10SCI3 decided to go BIG with their speed/time graphs. Investigating Newton's Laws and motion in physics can be tricky but working together they constructed their "Toilet Paper Ticker Tape".

The Ticker Tape Timer experiment is a classic, but can be temperamental to set up and fiddly to process. Doing it on a larger scale removes the frustration and allows the results to be processed together by the whole group simultaneously, getting everyone involved.

One downside is that one student has to operate as the toilet roll holder, but Jonny excelled in this capacity. Regarding this experiment Brendan said:

"It was simpler to do it that way. It made it easier to remember and we could do the measurements with a ruler."
